VOLUNTEER HOURS

A volunteer hour is one hour of time given, without compensation, to individuals or organizations in need. Members can identify opportunities by reaching out to local, coordinating agencies like the United Way, Volunteer Action Centers, VolunteerMatch.com or other volunteer search engines on the Web. Eligible projects include all service provided to nonprofits and charities deemed 501(c)3 by the Internal Revenue Service and other individual projects on a case by case basis. For example, individuals who volunteer by mentoring a child may not necessarily do so through a 501(c)3, but through a school. This service would qualify as hours toward the challenge as long as documentation is provided.
